The ***Teaching Math to People with Down syndrome and other Hands on Learners*** workshop describes survival math principles that apply to number sense, addition, place value, subtraction, use of the calculator, multiplication, division, money management, word problems, fractions and decimal. Activities such as games, working with concrete objects and generalizing math in the real world make the math learning real and fun for students. The contents of both *Teaching Math to Individuals with Down Syndrome and Other Hands-on Learners, Books 1 and 2* will be discussed by the author.

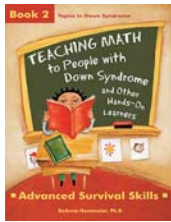
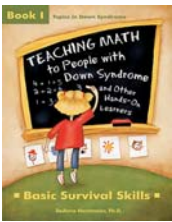
